CENTRAL BASIN WATER RIGHTS PANEL RDCIP WATER STORAGE ALLOCATION OR FUNDING REQUEST

The Central Basin Regional Disadvantaged Communities Incentive Program ("RDCIP") was established by the Central Basin Water Rights Panel ("WRP") and approved by the Court in June 2015. The RDCIP provides a framework to implement the program and can be found at www.cbwatermaster.org.

The RDCIP has a second priority right to occupy up to 23,000 acre-feet within the Community Storage Pool. This storage must be used to benefit Disadvantaged Communities ("DACs") within the Central Basin. A DAC is defined as any area that is served by a Water Purveyor and consisting of one or more contiguous census tracts which, based upon the most recent U.S. Census data, demonstrates a median household income which is less than eight percent (80%) of the median household income for all Census Tracts within the State of California. It is the responsibility of the applicant to demonstrate eligibility that the storage will benefit one or more DACs. While the program encourages partnerships, it is the responsibility of the applicant to identify all participants involved with the requested allocation, storage and/or project.

The RDCIP provides 2 opportunities for DACs to receive benefit: 1) a Water Storage Allocation; and 2) an Award of Bank Account Funds. Please note that all applications must include at least one party to the Central Basin Judgment. All parties to the Judgment participating in this application must be in good standing with the WRP.
